

From BQ to XBB: What you need to know about the newest, 'extremely contagious' COVID-19 variants.



Just in time for the holidays, coronavirus cases – and hospitalizations - are on the rise. To blame are the BQ.1, BQ.1.1, and, to a lesser extent for now, XBB variants. All

are descendants of the original BA.1 omicron variant that caused a massive spike in cases starting about a year ago.

These new variants are extremely contagious, "barking at the heels of measles, and that is quite a remarkable level of transmission," as <u>Ross Kedl</u>, Ph.D., a CU School of Medicine immunologist and vaccine specialist, put it. Read more here.

White House Launches National Non-fatal Opioid Overdose Dashboard

Resource aids communities in tracking overdoses



As part of its commitment to reversing the tide in fatal and non-fatal drug overdoses, the White House Office ER DATA, BETTER CARE, of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), in partnership with State EMS Offices and NHTSA, has

launched a real-time **dashboard** illustrating EMS responses to non-fatal opioid overdoses.

The HIPAA-compliant dashboard uses state-submitted, de-identified data from the National EMS Information System (NEMSIS) to allow local agencies to track EMS

activations for non-fatal overdoses at the state and county levels.

In a press release, the ONDCP states, "At a time when a non-fatal overdose is a leading predictor for a future fatal overdose, widespread access to this data will help first responders on the frontlines of the overdose epidemic target life-saving interventions such as the overdose-reversal medication naloxone."

New National Report on Workforce Engagement



To determine the extent to which EMS practitioners feel satisfied or engaged in their jobs – and their reasons for staying in or leaving the profession – NAEMT conducted a survey of EMS practitioners across the United States.

The survey, developed by subject matter experts serving on NAEMT's EMS Workforce Committee, was distributed electronically in May 2022. We received 1,284 completed surveys from paramedics, advanced EMTs, EMTs, and emergency medical responders (EMRs) in all 50 states, and representing all EMS delivery models.
