Sleep and Teamwork in EMS Study (SaFTiE)



The National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) has funded investigators at the University of Pittsburgh Department of Emergency Medicine to study sleep and

teamwork in EMS. We will first enroll EMS agencies and then enroll up to 15 front-line EMS clinicians. Agencies are eligible if they: provide 911 response and transport (ground and air); employ at least 20 paid personnel; allow crew members to use personal mobile phones on duty. Details here.
