Federal Funding Opportunity for Rural EMS Training

Applications are due May 1. The purpose of this program is to recruit and train EMS personnel in rural areas with a focus on addressing substance use disorders and co-occurring disorders - substance use and mental disorders.

Recipients will be expected to train EMS personnel on substance use disorder and cooccurring disorders, trauma-informed, recovery-based care for people with such disorders in emergency situations, and, as appropriate, maintain licenses and certifications relevant to serve in an EMS agency. March 8, 2023 – The International Board of Specialty Certification (IBSC) **announces** the new Certified Wilderness Paramedic for the paramedic/clinician working in an austere, wilderness, and/or remote setting. This specialty certification is linked to a National Association of EMS Physicians Wilderness EMS Committee project that outlined the disparity between the skills needed to manage patients in wilderness EMS environments versus the various scope of practice traditionally approved by state EMS regulators. 

Path4EMS: Colorado's EMS Peer Assistance Program
