Worm Pulled From Woman's Brain in Case That 'Stunned'

When they started the open biopsy, surgeons didn't know what they were going to find, but they certainly didn't expect this.

The stringlike worm was five-sixteenths of an inch long, was alive, and wiggled.

"It stunned everyone in that operating theater," says <u>Sanjaya Senanayake, MBBS</u>, an associate professor of infectious disease at Australian National University, Canberra, Australia, and senior author of the <u>case report</u> told *Medscape Medical News*.

Should Clinic BP Be Routinely Measured Lying Down?

Taking a patient's blood pressure (BP) while the patient is lying down may yield more information about their <u>cardiovascular risk</u> than taking the reading while the patient is sitting upright, new preliminary <u>research</u> suggests.

Ambulance 'response times' miss the big picture: health outcomes

Such a stringent and arbitrary requirement would be dangerous to those most in need of urgent attention and unaffordable if not impossible to implement. A broken arm is bad, but a cardiac arrest, stroke or bleeding from a severe motor vehicle trauma takes precedence. So, emergency rooms "triage" patients to determine an order of response. And we all accept that. Even if we don't like sitting in the ER a little longer. We get it.

Path4EMS: Colorado's EMS Peer Assistance Program
